

Citation of digital objects in repositories

The citation of digital objects is part of good scientific practice. Research data should be cited in the same way as other sources of information, such as articles and books. When using objects obtained through Phaidra, the resources should be referenced accordingly. Based on the [Joint Declaration of Data Citation Principles¹](#) and [Best Practice: Citation of resources, version 2.0²](#), the use of the following information is recommended:

- Creator: The creators, i. e. primary researchers or authors are displayed in the order in which they were added.
- Publication year: The year in which the resource was published in digital form.
- Title: The main title of the resource and any additional title must be indicated.
- Version: The version number of the resource.
- Publication agent: The name of the institution and/ or of the data centre, which has published the resource.
- Identifier: The global persistent identifier e.g. Digital Object Identifier (DOI), Handle-System (hdl). It should be displayed in the citation as linkable, permanent URL.

The form in which this information is presented depends on the used citation style. DOI-resources can be formatted using the [DOI Citation Formatter³](#).
